

What's In It for Me?

Isn't that always our first question, whether we verbalize it or not? Is it worth my time, what will I get out of it, how much will it cost me? It's a question of priorities. We can't be in everything, we can't say yes to every request, our resources of time, energy and money are limited. So, we have to choose, and our decision making process usually comes back to that basic question: What's in it for me? It's not a bad question, but it's an inadequate question.

There was a time when a president challenged his nation, "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country," and it captured the imagination of a generation. But that same generation turned into the "me" generation, who bought into the motto of the 1970's, "Have it your way." And every generation since has bought further and further into the belief that it's all about me.

I wish it were different in the church. Jesus' words in Luke 9 challenge us: *"If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will save it."* The choices we make really do reflect where our heart is.

Sometimes our best decisions have nothing to do with what we will get out of it. We make them because of what we can give, how we can serve, how we can reflect Jesus to others. And in the process, we find out that we get more out of those choices than all the other self-serving choices put together. We discover the truth of what Jesus says, that when we lose our life, we really do save it.

Getting involved – really involved – in the life of the church is like that. Yes, it will cost you some time and involve some sacrifice. Don't enter into it because of what you will get out of it, but because of what you can put into it and how you can be an encouragement to others. But in the process, don't be surprised if you find out that you get far more out of it than you ever put in.

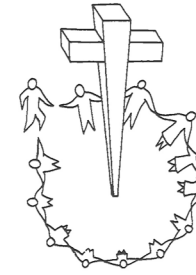
